“Mona this wasn’t easy for me to post a message because if I did it would bring your passing to a reality and I still grieve over you Sis. You were one of my best friends when we were kids way back in elementary school in Menlo Park. I think we were in the 2nd grade when you and I hung tight and always stood next to each other in every line up be it the cafeteria, field trip line, Picture Day line or PE line you were ALWAYS right behind me and we always sat at our desks next to each other in class because for many years including high school at MA we were alphabetically “Timmons and Turner” in that order. When we were just grade school girls our friends started calling us “MONA LISA” because most times you didn’t see one without the other. Girl we laughed all the time. I remember all the times we hung out at the playground after school. I remember going over to your house many times and I remember your 10th Birthday party in April 1977. It was a big deal our turning to the double digits and mine soon to come that Summer. I remember how you always dressed the best and your laugh because I was good for popping jokes. I have many many memories of you girl but one that was funniest was our Freshman year at MA when we had to learn how to swim in Mrs. Wimberly’s PE class. All year round Mrs. Wimberly had to separate us because we were two chatty chatty giggly giggling teenagers never taking any of her exercise instructions serious, mostly because we were either too nervous because the boys were looking LOL or because we didn’t want to sweat and mess up our hair. Mrs. Wimberly deserved a medal for putting up with us she truly was the coolest instructor. When we had to do Swimming for a month, Mrs. Wimberly realized that absolutely everybody in our class knew how to swim except for Lisa and Ramona LOL we were beyond scared of the water and feared we would flunk PE. Neither of us would take our hands off the edge and actually get to the middle of the water. Long story short, Mrs. Wimberly stayed with us for the remaining of classes left and taught you and I how to swim. As scared as we were together shivering and holding on to each other we managed to encourage one another and actually swam passing laps in the pool. I cherish that experience with you. Even after having not seen you much after

high school, a good 20 years had passed before we ran into each other at the store...oddly enough I was in line ahead of you and in a surreal moment you recognized me and called out my name. When I saw it was you we hugged and both of us were holding back the tears because we were knocking on Forty and hadn't seen each other in two decades. Your little girl was with you and my toddler son was with me as you and I stood in the parking lot and literally talked for 2 hours. Trying to squeeze in two decades worth of catching up and school girl giggles like time never passed as you belt out the same childhood laughter I so fondly remembered 😊 and hearing you once again telling me how funny crazy I am with my humor. For those couple of hours fate gave us a chance to once again be two 2nd graders in the school yard and two teenagers in the Main Hall being chatty chatty and giggly giggling Mona Lisa for a final time. We hugged and parted with "Girl we need to hook up" exchanged numbers and as expected life happens and we never saw each other again. I was living in the South when I got the devastating news of your passing away. I never spoke on losing my friend until today. Miss you Mona, MA having our 40th reunion seems insane because we're all still very much young at heart. I'm grateful for the opportunity on this Memorial page to finally say goodbye my friend. 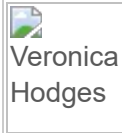
